5:00-7:00 PM



Lifting Up for Lift Off

M. Craig Barnes delivered a sermon at *Christianity Today International* September 19, 2000. In the sermon, he was quoted as saying:

I was asked to speak at the funeral of a man who had helped develop the Boeing 747 aircraft. After the service I spoke with the widow and commented on what a remarkable thing her late husband had done.

"The truth is, he worked on a little switchbox smaller than a loaf of bread," she said. "That's all he worked on for fifteen years. But when that 747 lifted off the ground for the first time, it was the happiest day of his life."

He worked on a tiny switchbox for more than a decade, yet the Boeing 747 couldn't have lifted off without this man's contribution. Often we think our seemingly small efforts aren't very important. But when the great kingdom of God "lifts off," we'll be thrilled to find out that our efforts were essential.

I confess, I have found myself unhappy with assignments God has given me in the kingdom. Too small, too hard, or too little appreciated, I've wondered why God didn't just find someone else. But allow me to share a few lessons I've learned – OR NEED TO LEARN! – along the way.

It's not the size, but the significance of the task.

Remembering to pack a lunchbox seems trivial, until the Master wants to raid it.

It's not the outlook, but the outcome. Noah built a boat in the desert, David picked a fight with a giant, and Samson went to war without weapons. Yet God made an overcomer of the underdog. He can do the same for you.

It's not today, but tomorrow. For fifteen years, the switchbox wasn't ready. Quit any day of the first 5474, and there is nothing to







show for the effort. It may not all come together until 5475, but the first 5474 are all just as important.

It takes more than me. While I work on a "switchbox," God has others working on the wings, the cockpit, and the landing gear. He even has a few working on paint colors and toilet seats! Progress isn't just measured by my switchbox, but by everyone's tasks as well. I'm counting on them; they're counting on me, too!

So let's not allow ourselves to get fatigued doing good. At the right time we will harvest a good crop if we don't give up, or quit. (Galatians 6:9 MSG)
