# FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR .... MAY 2025

Randy Frazee writes,

According to legend, the custom for many years on the Hawaiian Islands was for a suitor to pay for the right of asking his beloved's hand in marriage by giving her father cattle. Most young women of marrying age would require two, sometimes even three, cows. If a daughter was a special catch, she might fetch four cows. It is rumored that one father in the distant past received an unfathomable *five* cows for his amazingly gorgeous and charming daughter.

An islander named Sam Karoo had two daughters, and he faced a serious dilemma. No one on the islands considered his older daughter beautiful. Aware that her shyness and plain features were not assets for a proposal, Sam had accepted many years earlier that he would not likely fetch three cows for her. He dreamed of two but would settle for one. In fact, if he knew the man would treat her well, he would let her marry without receiving any cows. He felt fortunate that everyone agreed his *younger* daughter was definitely a three-cow kind of girl.

Then one day, Johnny Lingo, a wealthy landowner, came to pay Sam a visit. Everyone knew Johnny was ready to settle down and assumed he was coming to propose to Sam's younger daughter. But to the surprise of the whole town, and to Dad's delight, Johnny came a callin' for his older daughter.

It was more than Sam could've hoped for. *I may get three cows for her after all.* Then he let his imagination get the best of him and thought he might even receive four cows from the wealthy suitor. You can imagine Sam's shock when Johnny brought him *ten* cows for his daughter.

When the happy couple came back from a yearlong honeymoon, the villagers were amazed at the difference in the young wife's presence. She was strikingly beautiful, graceful, poised, confident, and self-assured. Everyone thought Johnny got a bargain paying only ten cows for her hand in marriage.

It was clear that Johnny had viewed Sam's older daughter differently than her father and the other villagers. He saw beyond her outward appearance and recognized the beauty of her heart and character. The value he placed on her true beauty helped her realize her truth worth. The moment he paid ten cows for her, she became a ten-cow wife! (*The Heart of the Story*, p. 105-106)

## Two quick thoughts:

A man can't help how beautiful his wife is when he gets married, but if after twenty years she is ugly, he has only himself to blame. Husbands and fathers, your wife and your children will assume the value you place on them is accurate – don't lowball them. They will become what you believe them to be, so see them as Your Savior sees them – worth pursuing until found, worth every drop of His blood, worth every moment of eternity.

And, more than ten cows, God paid His Son for you. Are you a one-Son kind of Christian?



Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.

#### What you need:

- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane
- Adult help



#### What you do:

- 1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
- 2. Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
- 3. On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
- 4. Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
- 5. Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
- 6. Trim off crusts with a serrated knife. Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles. Serve and enjoy!
