"Submission in Earthly Relationships"

The Apostle Paul wrote:

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother" — which is the first commandment with a promise — "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord. (Ephesians 6:1-4 NIV)

Beginning in Ephesians 5, the Apostle Paul addresses three relationships: wives and husbands, children and parents, and employee and employer. Both sides of each relationship have responsibilities to the other. Wives are to respect their husbands; husbands are to love their wives; children are to obey and honor their parents; parents are to train and instruct their children; employees are to obey and serve wholeheartedly; employers are to treat their employees well without threats. One verse summarizes the overall theme of those addressed:

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. (Ephesians 5:21 NIV)

Parents, you should submit to the needs of your children. Doing so requires you to "bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4 NIV). Taking children to church before they can take themselves, training them in prayer and Bible reading, and teaching them to tithe are just some of what is required. But don't miss the first part of Paul's instructions:

"Father, do not exasperate your children" (Ephesians 6:4 NIV).

Paul doesn't highlight any examples, so allow me to share a few from scripture.

Don't expect perfection

Paul elsewhere writes:

... for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23 NIV)

There is nothing wrong with your child that is not also wrong with you - a sinful nature. Just as you would appreciate grace when failing, extend the same to them.

Model repentance

If both of you know what it is like to sin, teach your child how to make amends after missing God's mark. Nothing was so impressive to me as a teenager as having a father who would apologize when wrong and without prompting. The lesson to me was a big – and godly – man would apologize and make right what they got wrong.

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. (James 5:16 NIV)

Love is spelled D-I-S-C-I-P-L-I-N-E

Love your child enough to discipline them. The best parent is the Lord. Here is what has been said:

... the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and he chastens everyone he accepts as his son. (Hebrews 12:6 NIV)

Discipline – properly administered early – leads to less and lesser discipline later. What parents don't address at home has to be addressed at school. What isn't addressed by parents must be addressed by teachers, spouses, bosses, or judges. Love your child enough to say – and enforce – "No!" It may be work for you now, but it may mean a better life for them later.
