From the Associate Pastor... Kingdom Wealth Series

Nothing reveals our priorities like how we handle our money. Jesus said,

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21 NIV)

Picture "treasure" and "heart" as two cars on a train. Which one is the engine and which one the caboose? For years I imagined my heart as the engine and my treasure as the caboose. My passions would cause me to open my wallet and give. But if you reread the verse, it is clear to Jesus how we spend our money drives our heart.

In 2008, I purchased my first brand new car – a 2008 Honda Civic LX, silver exterior with gray interior. It was a great step up from my first car – a 1971 Chevy Impala, two tone – rust and what was left of a dark green exterior. The foam seats looked like a dog was let loose with the doors locked. My first purchase was a lime-green seat cover. Every other purchase was gas.

Prior to buying the Civic, I never noticed them on the road. After I purchased it, I secretly congratulated every other driver I saw for the wise purchase. I washed the car. I cleaned the car. And I got upset when my boys spilled epoxy in the backseat – an event scarring enough I'm convinced my oldest tried to buy the car years later out of guilt (for the record, he was forgiven about an hour after the epoxy hit the seat). Paying \$17,000 for the car was a significant investment of money, and even more my heart. I CARED what happened to the car. Prior to the purchase, anyone but my boys could have spilled epoxy in the backseat, and I wouldn't have given it another thought. But after ... well, that was a different story!

April	Stuffies, Dolls and Accesso- ries	Stuffed animals, dolls; be sure they are small enough to tuck in a box with other items
May	Hygiene Items (no liquids)	Bar soap in original pack- aging, washcloths, hair- brushes, combs, solid deodorant, toothbrushes, etc.
June	Quality Toys, Wow Gifts	Soccer ball with pump, dolls, jump ropes, musical instruments, fishing gear, tools, sewing supplies, binoculars, etc.
July	Clothing (must be new)	Socks, shoes, shorts, pants, shirts, dresses, underwear, etc.
August	School Supplies (no liquids)	Pencils, crayons, pens, markers, paper, ruler, glue sticks, stickers, coloring books, pencil pouches, scissors, etc.
Septem- ber	Games	Puzzles, playing cards, handheld/travel games, jacks, marbles, flexible frisbee, tic-tac-toe, etc.
October	Greetings	Letters, photos, and drawings to include in shoeboxes
Novem- ber	Give	Monetary donations for shipping boxes (\$10 each)
Decem- ber	Pray	Pray for the journey of each shoebox and the children who will receive them.


