How to Develop a Gratitude Attitude

It's been said they are called the Ten Commandments, not the Ten Suggestions. The first four highlight one's relationship to God and the last six to one's neighbors. The last is unique as it forbids what no one can see. To covet is to have a wrong or excessive desire for something, and the tenth commandment forbids desiring those things our neighbor owns. Whether a house, spouse, servants, or animals, those who left Egypt were warned to keep their hearts and hands off. It was a problem then, and it's still a problem today.

Like water around a fish, we often become oblivious to what surrounds us. We look across the street, the parking lot, or room and think how happy we would be if only what we see was ours. Keeping up with the Joneses has been described as spending money we don't have to impress people we don't like. And too many of us regularly play the game.

Let me suggest the Gratitude Attitude as a humble replacement. Instead of looking around the neighborhood or community, take a few minutes to browse your house. Here's how to play. Take a few minutes in each room to notice everything you've acquired. The best players notice everything – furniture, carpet, decorations, etc. As you notice items, let your lips begin to audibly thank God (you may find it helpful to play solo, but your children or spouse might be helpful). If time is a factor, you might start with only one room or category of items (like gifts, certain colors, or recent acquisitions). Don't just thank God but think about the circumstances around how you ended up with the item. For instance, my green Disney Grumpy coffee mug reminds me of a family trip to Disney gifted by my parents. It also reminds me of my son lan who has already gone on record as wanting the cup "after I'm gone".

Most people who play a round or two of Gratitude Attitude quit before every item is covered, and with a smile on their face. God has been very good to most of us, and we have more than enough for which to be thankful.

Good luck and get ready player one!

SAVE THOSE CANCELLED STAMPS!

Thank you abundantly for those who continue to provide cancelled stamps for an important ministry! The income generated "goes to support the preparation, publishing and distribution of a Spanish language curriculum for Sunday Schools. More than 50 lesson series have been published and are being used in churches of 40 different denominations and missions in 19 different Spanish speaking countries in South America, Central America, Spain and even the USA." A total of \$35,000 was raised in 2023!

If you cut the stamps from the envelopes yourselves, please leave 1/4-1/3" all around the stamp. Cutting is always better than tearing as the corners tend to tear too close to the stamp. If you'd like, you may donate the entire envelope and I'll cut for you and recycle the remainder.

We are heading into a heavy-mailing season! Keep those stamps coming with you to church!


Dear Pastor Carr and SBC,
