



FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR AUGUST 2025

I'm not a golfer – unless you count the miniature version – and many of you are not either. I've played one round of golf in my life, and after shooting a 135 over eighteen holes (and much of the golf course), I retired from the sport. For the record, I came in last in a group of exactly two that day. I can appreciate how difficult the sport is and how much time it would take to become proficient let alone good.

Scottie Scheffler, the number one ranked golfer on the PGA tour, just won the Open Championship. He has won over ninety million dollars in his career – one of only four people to ever do so – and is only twenty-nine years old. To say he has been successful is an understatement.

Scheffler recently said:

This is not a fulfilling life. It's fulfilling from the sense of accomplishment, but it's not fulfilling from a sense of the deepest places of your heart.

Every day when I wake up early to go put in the work, my wife thanks me for going out and working so hard. When I get home, I try and thank her every day for taking care of our son.

That's why I talk about family being my priority because it really is. I'm blessed to be able to come out here and play golf, but if my golf ever started affecting my home life or it ever affected the relationship I have with my wife or my son, that's going to be the last day that I play out here for a living.

This is not the be all, end all. This is not the most important thing in my life. That's why I wrestle with, why is this so important to me? Because I'd much rather be a great father than I would be a great golfer. At the end of the day, that's what's more important to me.

Hearing what Scheffler said, Skip Bayless, sports commentator and television personality, responded:

I was jolted and jarred by what Scottie Scheffler said on the eve of the British Open. No, Scottie, no. God gave you spectacular ability to play the world's hardest game, gave you the strongest competitive drive since Tiger, gave you what Jack Nicklaus had, what Ben Hogan had. You can't just shrug it off at age 29 and focus on being a better father than a golfer. You can't do that, Scottie, no. God wants you to maximize the platform from which you can honor him, and encourage fans to open their hearts to him, to God.

That's what God has led or called you to do, Scottie. Not to focus on your wife and infant son before you are 30. Golf is just too hard; the line is just too fine between dominating and missing cuts.

I believe Scottie Scheffler is a true believer, that he is a legit God guy, that he does have God in his heart, but here's where Scottie Scheffler and I differ.

I felt called by God to be the very best truth-telling commentator and writer I could be, the very best. However, I could maximize my talent that God gave me, I'm going to do it. To do so, I sacrificed having children because I saw that properly and correctly raising children would be a huge time-draining distraction from maximizing my talents.

Allow me to share just a couple of brief comments from scripture.

First, FAMILY IS A GIFT FROM THE LORD.

He who finds a wife finds what is good and receives favor from the Lord. (Proverbs 18:22 NIV)

Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him. (Psalm 127:3 NIV)

The two greatest commandments both deal with relationships. To follow Jesus is to invest in relationships with both the Father and those He created. Paul warned Christians:

Anyone who does not provide for their relatives, and especially for their own household, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. (1 Timothy 5:8 NIV)

The word translated "provide" carries the idea of caring for something. It is not primarily a financial term.

Second, THE ULTIMATE SCORECARD IS CHARACTER.

Paul wrote:

Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. (I Corinthians 9:25 NIV)

Relatively few people follow golf. Even fewer can name more than a handful of past winners — even of the greatest golf tournaments. But wives remember if their husbands were grateful. Children remember if their fathers were present. It has been decades, but I can still remember moments spent together with my dad, words he shared, laughs he caused. People might not give him a trophy, but I'll give him a hug. He might not receive prize money, but he will have my gratitude. Multitudes might not crowd the fairways, but grandchildren will sit around the table.

And that's a reason to put in the work.


